Dr. Stephen Aronson received his MD from Tel Aviv University Medical School, completed his internship in Internal Medicine at Yale University School of Medicine, and his residency in psychiatry & fellowship in geriatric psychiatry at University of Michigan Medical Center. He is an Adjunct Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Michigan Medical School and is an attending physician at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor. Dr. Aronson works at the Mood & Memory Clinic in Ann Arbor, and is a member of the Medical and Scientific Advisory Council for the Alzheimer's Association – Greater MI Chapter.

Dr. Sid Gilman, FRCP, is William J. Herdman Distinguished University of Professor of Neurology, University of Michigan. He graduated from the School of Medicine University of California at Los Angeles, received his Intern in Medicine at the University of California Hospital, Los Angeles, his Resident in Neurology from Boston City Hospital, and teaching Fellow in Neurology from Harvard Medical School. Dr. Gilman is past President of the Michigan Neurological Association and American Neurological Association. His current areas of specialization include imaging studies of Alzheimer's disease as well as Immunotherapy for the treatment of Alzheimer's disease. Dr. Gilman is the author of countless articles, abstracts and books.

Stefanie Sinks, LMSW, is the Counselor/Care Manager at the Alzheimer's Association - Greater MI Chapter. She received her Bachelor of Arts in Spanish and Sociology from Muhlenberg College, and was awarded a Master of Social Work degree and Specialist in Aging Certificate from the University of Michigan School Social Work. Stefanie has been a guest lecturer on numerous dementia-related topics, as well as an instructor in the Gerontology Program at Eastern Michigan University. In addition to her work at the Alzheimer's Association, Stefanie is working on a clinical trial for a new Alzheimer's treatment medication, and is also working at the University of Michigan School of Social Work.
